Focus Question: What caused the Vietnam War?

Directions: Although direct American involvement in what was to become the Vietnam War in 1964 and lasted until 1975, the roots of the War were varied and can be traced back to the mid-1800s when the region became a colony of France. The secondary source provides historical context to the events leading up to U.S. military intervention in Vietnam through a brief history of colonization and anti-colonialism in Vietnam, and America's containment policies in post-World War II. For each time marker on the chart below describe key events, what happened, and why it is important towards understanding the origins of the Vietnam War.
